Although crop production has benefited from technological transformation, forage-based livestock production systems like those in the Northern Great Plains lag behind. This session will discuss some of the current technologies available to livestock producers such as virtual fencing, precision feeding and weighing cattle, enteric emission measurements, and satellite imagery.
