Banks and their employees are cornerstones of their communities, providing philanthropy and volunteer leadership that helps transform lives.

CorTrust Bank employees participated in Rake the Town, which helps individuals within the Sioux Falls metro area over the age of 60, who are not financially or physically able, complete their yard work.
